## Dorr/Leighton Sewer Authority November 14, 2019

- 1. The annual meeting of the Dorr/Leighton Sewer Authority was called to order by Chairman Deer at 9 a.m. on November 14, 2019 at the Leighton Township Hall. (Note change of time from Noon to 9 a.m.)

- 5. Motion by Sewers, support by Overmyer to approve the minutes of August 15, 2019 as presented. All members voted yes. Motion carried.
- 6. Motion by Nieuwenhuis, support by Sewers to approve the meeting agenda as presented. All members voted yes. Motion carried.
- 7. Mieras reported that the bid process for plant expansion is progressing with a bid opening set for November 26. Swets noted that the bid tabulations will be reviewed by Rural Development and then the next action will be to hold a special meeting to adopt the bond resolution. Following that, the contract will be awarded and 2-4 weeks after that, closing will be scheduled. (A tentative date of December 5, 2019 at 10 a.m. was set to adopt the bond resolution.)
